



## Walk for Whoopi's Fund and give a homeless dog or cat a second chance!

Meet a few of the many lives Homeward Pet supporters, like YOU, have helped through the Whoopi's Fund – Special Needs program:



**Quasimodo:** At 7-weeks old and a ball of energy, Quasi was diagnosed with hemophilia, and every new tooth could've caused a life-threatening loss of blood. Many wouldn't have given him a chance. Our vet team did. Now a year old, Quasi is strong and thriving in his forever home.

**Chloe:** Chloe, a two and a half year old Australian Cattle Dog mix, arrived at Homeward Pet recovering from a torn ACL. After 10 weeks of rehab, she was still painful and not healing correctly. We opted for a major TPLO surgery, and placed her in a foster home for post-operative physical therapy, ice and restricted activity, slowly building her endurance and muscle.



**Mick:** Mick's extensive veterinary care started with having all his teeth removed. Following surgery, he spent 5 days at the emergency clinic being treated for pneumonia, getting IV fluids and antibiotics, oxygen therapy and 24-hour monitoring. Mick's care was made possible by generous supporters like you.

**Puggsley:** The sweetest pug you'll ever meet, Puggsley was diagnosed with low grade mast cell tumors, which can spread to the rest of the body. Our vet team acted quickly to remove three tumors, completely excising them, and the prognosis is good for this wonderful 8-year old now living cancer-free in his forever home!



**Teddy and Wolfy:** These tiny strays were dehydrated, underweight and suffering from upper respiratory infections. Placed in foster care, it took Teddy a month of treatment and TLC to overcome his severe eye issue.

**Tia:** A former puppy mill breeder now in her golden years, Tia needed extra-special medical care: from treating an ear infection and eye ulcers, to removing masses on her front paw, on her lip and her eyelid, and a mammary gland tumor on her left side. She also needed lots of love, which she got from the staff and volunteers at Homeward Pet, and continues to get every day in her new home.
